

COVID-19 – Information for Patients attending The Digestive Health Centre

The Digestive Health Centre is following all DHHS, Commonwealth, GESA, NSQHS and other official recommendations to respond to the current outbreak of coronavirus disease (COVID-19). We have stringent infection control procedures to ensure the safety of our staff, patients and visitors.

We are excited to be back to full capacity. All elective colonoscopy & gastroscopy procedures are now being performed at The Digestive Health Centre. Our consulting services are also fully operation, including face to face consulting. Telehealth appointments are still available until March 2021 for patients who cannot attend the centre. This includes our paediatric and allied health professionals.

In the interests of patient and staff safety, and to reduce COVID-19 in the broader community we have put a range of measures and precautions in place.

These include:

- Screening of our staff
- Pre operative COVID-19 testing available
- Social distancing practiced throughout the facility
- Additional cleaning and sanitation measures have been implemented
- Placement of extra Hand hygiene products around the facility
- Requiring all attending patients/carers/visitors to wear a mask
- Screening patients and visitors in order to provide safe care
- Limiting visitors/carer access
- Equipping our Endoscopists, Anaesthetists and Nurses with appropriate personal protective equipment
- Offering Telehealth (phone) consultations for all patients
- Conducting pre admission nurse consultations over the phone instead of face to face
- Preparation instructions are emailed to all patients undergoing a procedure
OR Preparation kits are posted, time allowing
- Offering cashless transactions.
- Providing through post procedure follow up calls

At the Digestive Health Centre, your Digestive Health is our priority. As we all navigate our way through this pandemic you can be assured that we will continue to provide the best quality of care to all of our patients.
